Winterville Utilities Electric Rate Change "Power Cost Adjustment (PCA)"

As everyone is aware, Winterville enacted a Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) to the Electric portion of the Town's Utility Bill in the Fall of 2022. This was done in an effort to keep the Town's financial position secure during the recent global events which has had an adverse impact on the costs of purchasing energy.

The original PCA was \$.05 per kWh. In March 2023, Town Council lowered the PCA to \$.025 per kWh. The PCA was lowered again to \$.015 per kWh in July 2023, as some of the energy pricing continued to decrease. The rate of \$.015 will remain in effect until the current rate review process has been completed.

The Town is committed to continually reviewing the energy market and making more positive adjustments to the PCA, as we are able to level the financial impact to the Town. Staff will continue to review all options available to the Town and will keep citizens aware as changes are made.

Did You Know...

Most sanitary sewer backups occur between your home and the Town's sewer main? You can help prevent a costly and unsanitary overflow by following a few simple steps:

Do

- Scrape excess grease in a container and dispose of it in the garbage.
- Place food scraps in waste containers or garbage bags for disposal with solid wastes or start a compost pile; promote use of scraping prior to washing.
- Place a wastebasket in the bathroom to dispose of solid waste. Disposable diapers, condoms, and personal hygiene products do not belong in the sewer system.
- Promote the concept of "3 R's": Reduce, Reuse, Recycle.

Do Not

- Pour grease, fats, and oils from cooking down the drain.
- * Use the toilet as a wastebasket.
- Use the sewer as a means of disposing food scraps.
