## **Town Council requested that we look into a way to provide more citizen access to our meetings and information**

- We first upgraded our website and provided content management back into the hands of departments.
- We then began looking at ways to supplement our audio/video coverage and delivery.

**Several different software packages and delivery methods were investigated. We based our assessments on:**

- 1. *Quality***
- 2. *Service Provided***
- 3. *Simplicity***
- 4. *Cost***

## **We elected to use Ustream and Youtube as our platforms of choice at the present**

- Provided a live stream of the content
- Archived material can be kept for approximately 25 hours or possibly more of material
- Download ability for offline archiving
- Software available at a low cost to publish
- No or small recurring service cost

# Our setup consists of the following:

- 3 Axis IP Cameras



- 1 license of Ustream Producer Studio

## **We recorded our first meeting after many tests on Monday, May 14**

- Successes were found but also failures
- We have modified our shots and focus
- Learned from preconceived ideas of what works best versus reality
- Recorded again at June meeting with these settings and deemed ready to “go live” in July
