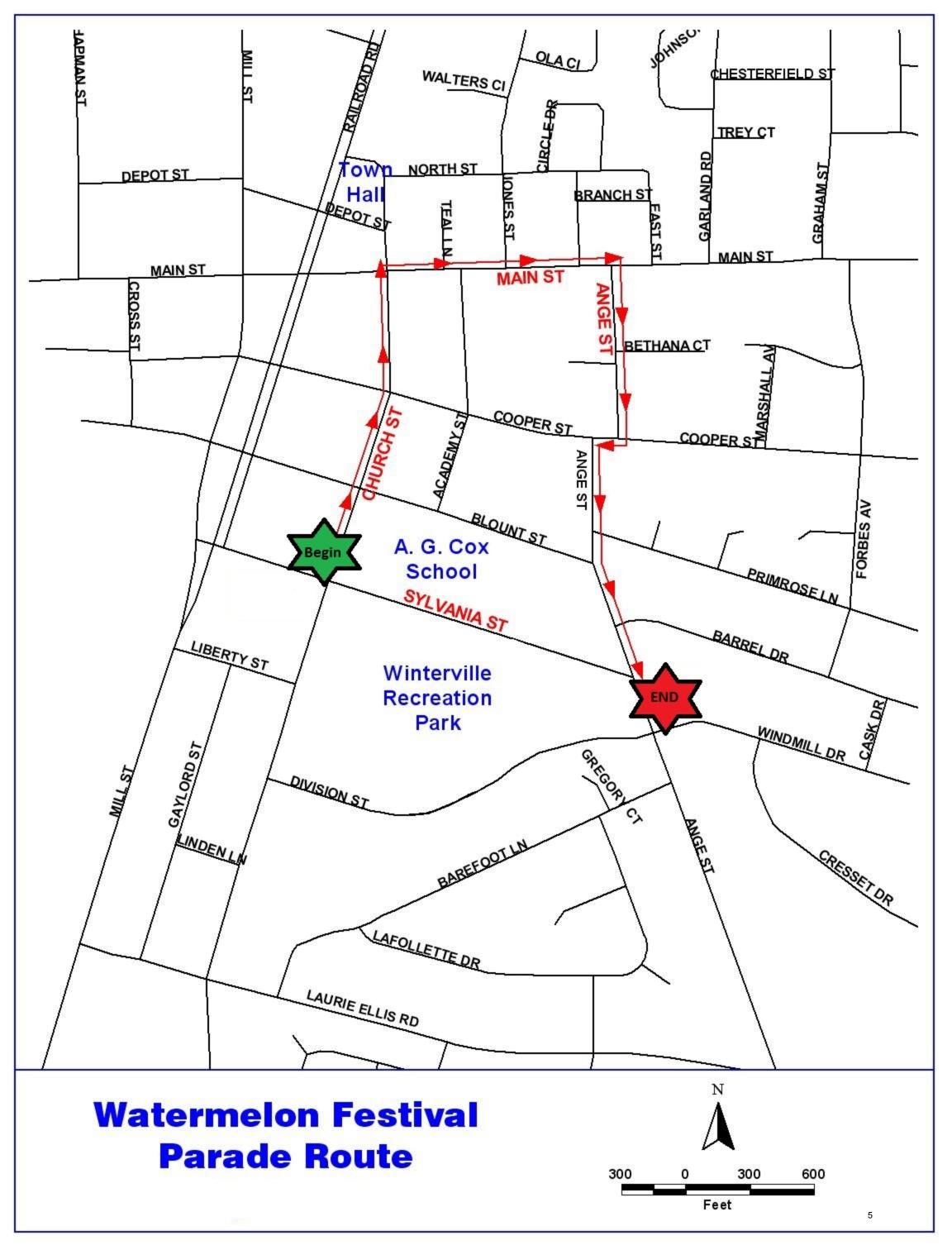

The Town has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$1,094,000 from the North Carolina Rural Economic Development division of the NC Department of Commerce. The funds were provided for Disaster Recovery from hurricane Mathew. The Town applied and was awarded \$1,094,000 for the replacement of old undersized metal tile with a new box culvert. The new culvert will greatly increase the capacity over the current situation. This will allow for storm water to be removed from the area near the culvert at a much faster rate. The grant is being managed by the Golden Leaf Foundation. Due to the fact that this was an unfunded project the grant is intended to cover 100% of the project based on the preliminary engineer's estimates. There are currently no town funds involved with the project.

Budgetary Impact: No direct cost to the Town.

Recommendation: Adopt the budget ordinance.

TOWN OF WINTERVILLE CAPITAL PROJECT BUDGET ORDINANCE CHAPMAN STREET CULVERT PROJECT

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Winterville, North Carolina, that pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following capital project ordinance is hereby adopted:

Section 1: The project authorized is for design and construction of a new box culvert to replace the current metal pipe that exist where Nobel Canal crosses underneath Chapman St, This drainage lateral is one of the main tributaries that remove storm water from the north side of the Town. Funding for this project is provided by a grant awarded to the Town from NC Rural Economic Development, and managed by the Golden Leaf Foundation.

Section 2: The following amounts are appropriated for the project:

Section 3: The following revenue is anticipated to be available for this project:

<u>Section 4:</u> The finance Officer is hereby directed to maintain within the Capital Project Fund sufficient detailed accounting records to satisfy the requirements of the financing agreements.

<u>Section 5:</u> Funds may be advanced from the Storm water Fund or from the General Fund for the

purpose of making payments that are due.

<u>Section 6:</u> The Finance Director is directed to report, on a monthly basis, the financial status of each project element in Section 2 and on the total revenues received or claimed.

Section 7: Copies of this capital project budget ordinance shall be furnished to the Town Clerk, Governing Board, Finance Director, and Town Manager (Budget Officer) to be kept on file by them for their direction in the disbursement of funds.

Supporting Documentation

In February 2018, Council approved the cost sharing of sidewalk improvements along the Old Tar Road corridor in conjunction with the upcoming NCDOT widening project. The original project included 5-foot sidewalks on both sides of the corridor. Town staff requested evaluating the installation of an 8-foot sidewalk on the east side of Old Tar Road. NCDOT and their consultant confirmed the additional sidewalk can be located within the existing/proposed right-of-way and would not require additional right-of-way acquisition. As always, the Town has a cost-share of 20% of the construction cost of the sidewalk along the corridor. 100% of the cost for additional work above and beyond the proposed 5-foot wide sidewalk (betterments), is the Town's responsibility. During the February meeting the estimated cost for the Town provided by NCDOT was \$127,629. Based on the updated costs and quantities, the estimate provided by NCDOT in the attached Municipal Agreement is \$131,184. As stated during the February meeting and included in Section 10.d of the Agreement, upon completion of the project, NCDOT will invoice the Town for the Town's share of the actual costs of the betterments.

Budgetary Impact: \$131,184 (estimated).

Recommendation: Authorization to execute agreement with NCDOT.

THIS MUNICIPAL AGREEMENT is made and entered into on the last date executed below, by and between the North Carolina Department of Transportation, an agency of the State of North Carolina, hereinafter referred to as the "Department" and the Town of Winterville, a local government entity, hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality", and Pitt County, a local government entity, hereinafter referred to as the "County".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Department has plans to make certain street and highway constructions and improvements within the Municipality/County under Project U-2817, in Pitt County; and,

WHEREAS, the Department and the Municipality have agreed that the municipal limits, as of the date of the awarding of the contract for the construction of the above-mentioned project, are to be used in determining the duties, responsibilities, rights and legal obligations of the parties hereto for the purposes of this Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, this Agreement is made under the authority granted to the Department by the North Carolina General Assembly, including but not limited to, the following legislation: General Statutes of North Carolina (NCGS), Section 136-66.1, Section 160A-296 and 297, Section 136-18, and Section 20-169, to participate in the planning and construction of a Project approved by the Board of Transportation for the safe and efficient utilization of transportation systems for the public good; and,

WHEREAS, the parties to this Agreement have approved the construction of said Project with cost participation and responsibilities for the Project as hereinafter set out.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto, each in consideration of the promises and undertakings of the other as herein provided, do hereby covenant and agree, each with the other, as follows:

SCOPE OF THE PROJECT

- The Project consists of improvements on SR 1700 (Evans Street/Old Tar Road) from SR 1711 (Worthington Road) in Winterville to US 264A (Greenville Boulevard) in Greenville.
- 2. At the request of the Municipality, and in accordance with the Department's Pedestrian Policy Guidelines, the Department shall include provisions in its construction contract for the construction of new sidewalk within the Municipal limits and for portions within the County limits of the project: 5 foot wide sidewalk on the west side of Evans Street from SR 1171 (Cooper Street) to the Town limits north of Cedar Ridge Drive and from 1100 feet south of Firetower Road to Firetower Road; and 8 foot sidewalk along the east side of Evans Street from SR 1171 (Worthington Road) to the Town limits north of Cedar Ridge. Said work shall be performed in accordance with the Department's policies, procedures, standards, and specifications, and the following provisions.

PLANNING AND DESIGN

3. The Department shall prepare the environmental and/or planning document, and obtain any environmental permits needed to construct the Project, and prepare the Project plans and specifications needed to construct the Project. All work shall be done in accordance with departmental standards, specifications, policies and procedures.

RIGHT OF WAY

- 4. The Department shall be responsible for acquiring any needed right of way required for the Project. Acquisition of right of way shall be accomplished in accordance with the policies and procedures set forth in the North Carolina Right of Way Manual.
- 5. It is understood by both parties that all work for the betterments shall be performed within the existing right of way. However, should it become necessary, the Municipality, at no expense or liability whatsoever to the Department, shall provide any needed right of way and or construction easements for the construction of the betterments, and remove from said rights of way all obstructions and encroachments of any kind or character. Acquisition of any needed right of way shall be performed in accordance with the following state and federal policies and procedures, "Right of Way Acquisition Policy and Land Acquisition Policy, contained in the Federal-Aid Policy Guide, Part 712, Subpart B", and the North Carolina Right of Way Manual (Uniform Relocation)

Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970). The Department shall be indemnified and held harmless from any and all damages and claims for damages associated with the acquisition of any construction easements and/or right of way.

UTILITIES

6. It is understood that there are no municipally-owned water and sewer lines to be adjusted or relocated at this time. If during the project it becomes necessary to adjust or relocate municipallyowned water and/or sewer lines a separate Utility Agreement will be prepared at the appropriate time.

CONSTRUCTION

7. The Department shall construct, or cause to be constructed, the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications of said Project as filed with, and approved by, the Department. The Department shall administer the construction contract for said Project.

MAINTENANCE

- 8. Upon completion of the Project:
 - A. The Department shall be responsible for all traffic operating controls and devices which shall be established, enforced, and installed and maintained in accordance with the North Carolina General Statutes, the latest edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways, the latest edition of the "Policy on Street and Driveway Access to North Carolina Highways", and departmental criteria.
 - B. The roadway improvement(s) shall be a part of the State Highway System and owned and maintained by the Department.
- 9. The Municipality, at no expense to the Department, shall assume all maintenance responsibilities for the sidewalk within the Municipal limits and for those portions within the County limits and release the Department from all liability relating to such maintenance.

BETTERMENT COSTS AND FUNDING

10. The Municipality shall participate in the Betterment costs of the Project as follows:

- A. In accordance with the Pedestrian Policy Guidelines, the Municipality shall reimburse the Department twenty percent (20%) of the actual cost, including administrative costs, of the work associated with the construction of the new 5 foot wide sidewalk. The Department shall participate in eighty percent (80%) of the actual cost of the new sidewalk for that portion of the project within the corporate limits, where new sidewalk is to be installed. The estimated cost of the new sidewalk is \$274,347. The estimated cost to the Municipality is \$54,869. Both parties understand that this is an estimated cost and is subject to change.
- B. .For all other Betterments, the Municipality shall participate as follows:

C. TOTAL ESTIMATED COST TO THE MUNICIPALITY: \$131,184

- D. Upon completion of the Project, the Department will invoice the Municipality for their share of the actual costs of the Betterments. Reimbursement to the Department shall be made in one final payment within sixty days of invoicing by the Department. A late payment penalty and interest shall be charged on any unpaid balance due in accordance with NCGS § 147-86.23.
- E. In the event the Municipality fails for any reason to pay the Department in accordance with the provisions for payment herein above provided, NCGS § 136-41.3 authorizes the Department to withhold so much of the Municipality's share of funds allocated to said Municipality by NCGS § 136-41.1 until such time as the Department has received payment in full under the reimbursement terms set forth in this Agreement

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

- 11. It is the policy of the Department not to enter into any agreement with another party that has been debarred by any government agency (Federal or State). The Municipality certifies, by signature of this agreement, that neither it nor its agents or contractors are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any Federal or State Department or Agency.
- 12. To the extent authorized by state and federal claims statutes, each party shall be responsible for its respective actions under the terms of this agreement and save harmless the other party from any claims arising as a result of such actions.
- 13. All terms of this Agreement are subject to available departmental funding and fiscal constraints.

- 14. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and there are no understandings or agreements, verbal or otherwise, regarding this Agreement except as expressly set forth herein.
- 15. The parties hereby acknowledge that the individual executing the Agreement on their behalf is authorized to execute this Agreement on their behalf and to bind the respective entities to the terms contained herein and that he has read this Agreement, conferred with his attorney, and fully understands its contents.
- 16. A copy or facsimile copy of the signature of any party shall be deemed an original with each fully executed copy of the Agreement as binding as an original, and the parties agree that this Agreement can be executed in counterparts, as duplicate originals, with facsimile signatures sufficient to evidence an agreement to be bound by the terms of the Agreement.
- 17. By Executive Order 24, issued by Governor Perdue, and N.C. G.S.§ 133-32, it is unlawful for any vendor or contractor (i.e. architect, bidder, contractor, construction manager, design professional, engineer, landlord, offeror, seller, subcontractor, supplier, or vendor), to make gifts or to give favors to any State employee of the Governor's Cabinet Agencies (i.e., Administration, Commerce, Environmental Quality, Health and Human Services, Information Technology, Military and Veterans Affairs, Natural and Cultural Resources, Public Safety, Revenue, Transportation, and the Office of the Governor).

IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED upon that the approval of the Project by the Department is subject to the conditions of this Agreement.

The Town is purchasing a new Vac Con Sewer Truck in the current fiscal year. Staff anticipates arrival of the new truck by the end of August. Staff proposes to declare the current truck (VIN 2FZAATDC47AY09686) as surplus. The Town of Grifton does not currently have a Vac Truck and has made an offer of \$82,500 for the Town's current truck. Staff had budgeted income of \$80,000 for the sale of its current truck in the current budget so the amount offered by Grifton is slightly above that. Grifton has proposed to pay a \$15,500 deposit once the sale is approved by Council, and pay another \$8,000 at the time they take possession of the truck. The remaining balance would be paid in four (4) equal installments of \$14,750 per year for the next four fiscal years (starting in FY 2019-2020). An Agreement would be drafted by the Town Attorney prior to the sale requiring that the Town of Grifton provide proof of insurance on the truck for the duration of the payments. The Town of Winterville would not relinquish the old truck until the new truck has arrived.

Selling the truck to the Town of Grifton would help strengthen the Town's position in case of emergency as the Town of Grifton could provide emergency backup with this truck in the event that the Town ever needed it. It is not uncommon for the Town's of Ayden, Grifton, and/or Winterville to request assistance from the other Town's with specialty equipment such as Vac Truck's.

Budgetary Impact: \$80,000 was budgeted as income in the current fiscal year for the sale of this truck. Only \$23,500 would be realized this fiscal year with the rest of the balance spread out over four (4) years.

Recommendation: Declaration of Surplus of truck and approval of sale to Town of Grifton for \$82,500 upon arrival of Town's new truck.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, H-GAC is a regional planning commission and political subdivision of the State of Texas operating under Chapter 391, Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, H-GAC is authorized to contract with eligible entities to perform governmental functions and services, including the purchase of goods and services; and

WHEREAS, in reliance on such authority, H-GAC has instituted a cooperative purchasing program under which it contracts with eligible entities under the Act; and

WHEREAS, End User has represented that it is an eligible entity under the Act, that its governing body has authorized this Contract on *08/13/2018 (Date), and that it desires to contract with H-GAC on the terms set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, H-GAC and the End User do hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1: LEGAL AUTHORITY

The End User represents and warrants to H-GAC that (1) it is eligible to contract with H-GAC under the Act because it is one of the following: a local government, as defined in the Act (a county, a municipality, a special district, or other political subdivision of the State of Texas or any other state), or a combination of two or more of those entities, a state agency (an agency of the State of Texas as defined in Section 771.002 of the Texas Government Code, or a similar agency of another state), or a non-profit corporation created and operated to provide one or more governmental functions and services, and (2) it possesses adequate legal authority to enter into this Contract.

ARTICLE 2: APPLICABLE LAWS

H-GAC and the End User agree to conduct all activities under this Contract in accordance with all applicable rules, regulations, and ordinances and laws in effect or promulgated during the term of this Contract.

ARTICLE 3: WHOLE AGREEMENT

This Contract and any attachments, as provided herein, constitute the complete contract between the parties hereto, and supersede any and all oral and written agreements between the parties relating to matters herein.

ARTICLE 4: PERFORMANCE PERIOD

The period of this Contract shall be for the balance of the fiscal year of the End User, which began * 07/01/2018 and ends * 06/30/2019. This Contract shall thereafter automatically be renewed annually for each succeeding fiscal year, provided that such renewal shall not have the effect of extending the period in which the End User may make any payment due an H-GAC contractor beyond the fiscal year in which such obligation was incurred under this Contract.

ARTICLE 5: SCOPE OF SERVICES

The End User appoints H-GAC its true and lawful purchasing agent for the purchase of certain products and services through the H-GAC Cooperative Purchasing Program. End User will access the Program through <u>HGACBuy.com</u> and by submission of any duly executed purchase order, in the form prescribed by H-GAC to a contractor having a valid contract with H-GAC. All purchases hereunder shall be in accordance with specifications and contract terms and pricing established by H-GAC. Ownership (title) to products purchased through H-GAC shall transfer directly from the contractor to the End User.

ARTICLE 6: PAYMENTS

H-GAC will confirm each order and issue notice to contractor to proceed. Upon delivery of goods or services purchased, and presentation of a properly documented invoice, the End User shall promptly, and in any case within thirty (30) days, pay H-GAC's contractor the full amount of the invoice. All payments for goods or services will be made from current revenues available to the paying party. In no event shall H-GAC have any financial liability to the End User for any goods or services End User procures from an H-GAC contractor.

ARTICLE 7: CHANGES AND AMENDMENTS

This Contract may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties, except that any alterations, additions, or deletions to the terms of this Contract which are required by changes in Federal and State law or regulations are automatically incorporated into this Contract without written amendment hereto and shall become effective on the date designated by such law or regulation.

H-GAC reserves the right to make changes in the scope of products and services offered through the H-GAC Cooperative Purchasing Program to be performed hereunder.

ARTICLE 8: TERMINATION PROCEDURES

H-GAC or the End User may cancel this Contract at any time upon thirty (30) days written notice by certified mail to the other party to this Contract. The obligations of the End User, including its obligation to pay H-GAC's contractor for all costs incurred under this Contract prior to such notice shall survive such cancellation, as well as any other obligation incurred under this Contract, until performed or discharged by the End User.

ARTICLE 9: SEVERABILITY

All parties agree that should any provision of this Contract be determined to be invalid or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect any other term of this Contract, which shall continue in full force and effect.

ARTICLE 10: FORCE MAJEURE

To the extent that either party to this Contract shall be wholly or partially prevented from the performance within the term specified of any obligation or duty placed on such party by reason of or through strikes, stoppage of labor, riot, fire, flood, acts of war, insurrection, accident, order of any court, act of God, or specific cause reasonably beyond the party's control and not attributable to its neglect or nonfeasance, in such event, the time for the performance of such obligation or duty shall be suspended until such disability to perform is removed; provided, however, force majeure shall not excuse an obligation solely to pay funds. Determination of force majeure shall rest solely with H-GAC.

ARTICLE 11: VENUE

Supporting Documentation

The Town Council has approved the purchase of two pieces of fire apparatus. The E-One Pumper was approved in last fiscal year's budget in the amount of \$513,000. The Council also approved the purchase of an Aerial Platform Truck in the 2018-2019 budget. The budget allowed for \$600,000 of the funds to come from financing, and the remainder of the budget of \$500,000 was to come from Fund Balance.

We received quotes from 5 lending institutions. Southern Bank and Trust was the low bidder with a rate of 2.73% for both pieces of equipment. We also discussed lending options with USDA and the current rate was in the amount of 3.875%. However, they only finance at a minimum of 20 years. Historically the Town has not financed vehicles and equipment over 7 years.

We are recommending accepting Southern Bank's proposal for both pieces of equipment with the 5 year term for the pumper and a 7 year term for the Aerial Platform Truck.

Budgetary Impact: Annual debt service payments in the amount of: Pumper \$116,644. Aerial \$102,094.

Recommendation: Approve the Financing Agreement as recommended.

Resolution Approving Financing Terms

WHEREAS: The Town of Winterville (the "Town") has previously determined to undertake a project for the financing of a E-One Fire Pumper truck, a 2019 Aerial Platform Truck, and the Finance Officer has now presented a proposal for the financing of such equipment.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, as follows:

- 1. The Town hereby determines to finance the Project through Southern Bank and Trust Company, in accordance with the proposal dated October 27th, 2017. The amount financed shall not exceed 1,131,171.00, the annual interest rate (in the absence of default or change in tax status) shall not exceed 2.73%, and the financing term shall not exceed five (5) years for the E-One Pumper and seven (7) years for Aerial Platform truck. There will be two separate amortization schedules. One for each piece of apparatus.
- 2. All financing contracts and all related documents for the closing of the financing (the "Financing Documents") shall be consistent with the foregoing terms. All officers and employees of the Town are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any Financing Documents, and to take all such further action as they may consider necessary or desirable, to carry out the financing of the Project as contemplated by the proposal and this resolution.
- 3. The Finance Officer is hereby authorized and directed to hold executed copies of the Financing Documents until the conditions for the delivery of the Financing Documents have been completed to such officer's satisfaction. The Finance Officer is authorized to approve changes to any Financing Documents previously signed by Town officers or employees, provided that such changes shall not substantially alter the intent of such documents or certificates from the intent expressed in the forms executed by such officers. The Financing Documents shall be in such final forms as the Finance Officer shall approve, with the Finance Officer's release of any Financing Document for delivery constituting conclusive evidence of such officer's final approval of the Document's final form
- 4. The Town shall not take or omit to take any action the taking or omission of which shall cause its interest payments on this financing to be includable in the gross income for federal income tax purposes of the registered owners of the interest payment obligations. The Town hereby designates its obligations to make principal and interest payment under the Financing Documents as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for the purpose of the Internal Revenue Code Section 265(b)(3).
- 5. All prior actions of Town officers in furtherance of the purposes of this resolution are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed. All other resolutions (or parts thereof) in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed, to the extent of the conflict. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

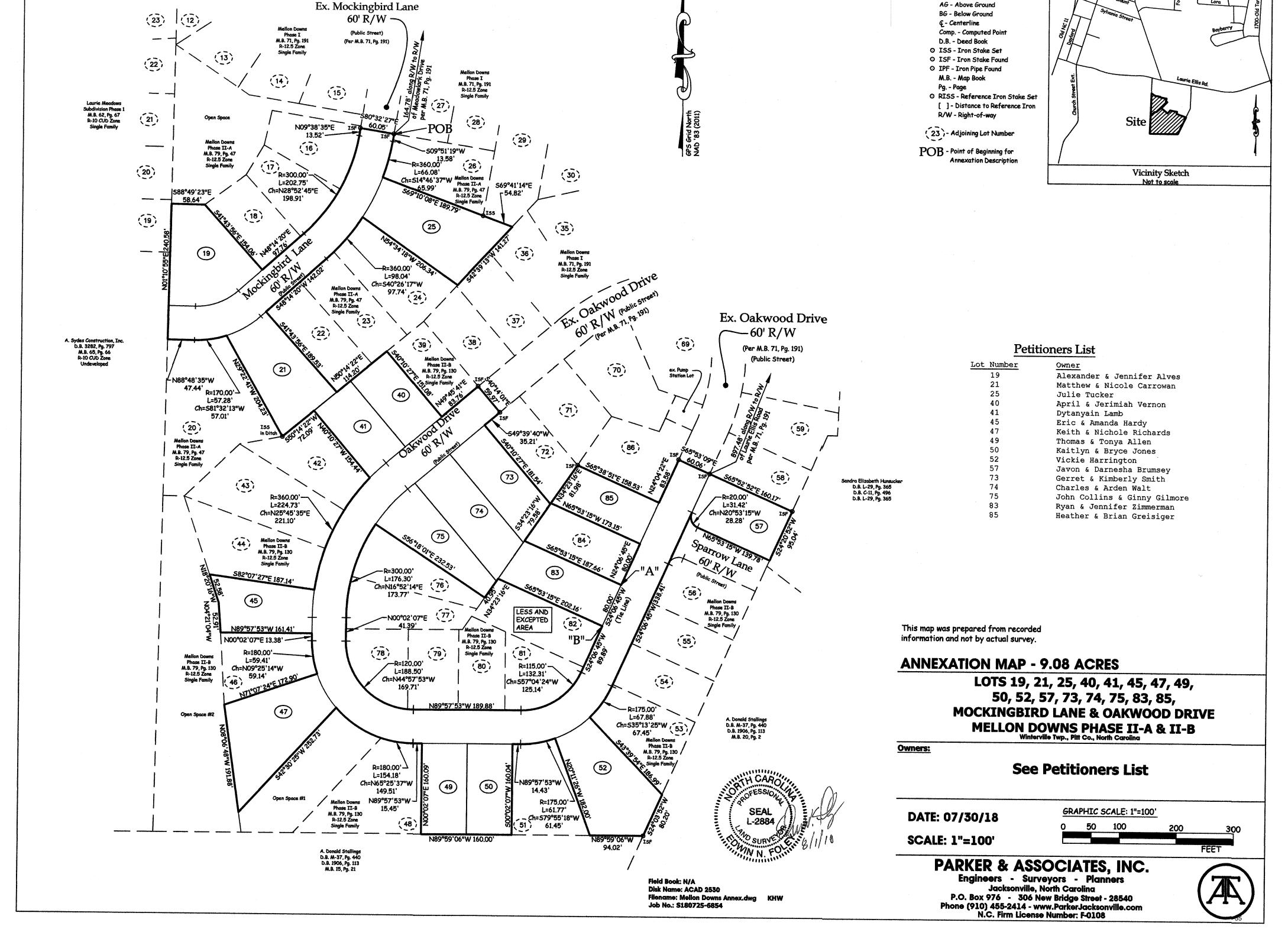

Supporting Documentation

The condition of Vernon Avenue between Drexel Lane and Cooper Street has deteriorated rapidly since the harsh weather the Town experienced this winter. Due to its condition and need for immediate repair staff proposes to change order the repair into the current street improvements project. To remove the existing asphalt and subgrade to a depth of 10" and replace with 8" of new stone and 2" of asphalt the cost will be approximately \$48,068.00. I have also estimated a cost of approximately \$10,000.00 to undercut approximately one-half of the street subgrade a depth of 24" if unsuitable soils are encountered. There is likely to be a small amount of contingency money left when the current project is completed barring any unforeseen circumstances at Chapman Street. There is also \$100,000.00 in the current budget year approved for resurfacing. A combination of these funds would be used to cover the cost of this additional work. The Contractor has agreed to perform the additional work at the contract unit prices as well.

Additionally, there may be a small increase in the engineer's fees for construction administration as the contract will need to be extended for the additional work. Due to the NCDOT Boyd Street project the contract will need to be extended regardless of Vernon Ave. due to staff wanting to avoid issues with the NCDOT contractor damaging new asphalt on Chapman Street.

Budgetary Impact: Funds for the additional work and any additional Engineering fees are available in the current project contract and the current fiscal year's approved budget.

Recommendation: Approval of additional patching at Vernon Ave. and associated engineering fees (if any).
