Tips for reducing trash from blowing around On windy days

Trash

- 1. The number one way to prevent blowing litter is to bag all your trash before placing it in the bin. This is especially important for small, lightweight items like Styrofoam packing peanuts.
- 2. Compact the trash if you have loose items, place bagged trash on top of them to prevent them from blowing out of the cart.

Making sure the lid is shut and bagging your household garbage prevents windblown litter while your container is curbside, as well as during the collection process.

This will help prevent trash from escaping your container or our collection trucks and landing onto the streets of your neighborhood.

Recycling

1. If possible, place heavier recyclables toward the top of the cart to weigh down loose papers, however, do not bag your recyclables to keep them from blowing out of the cart.

The bottom line is this – when it comes to garbage and recycling collection on a windy day, it only takes a little extra time to reduce blowing litter. Everyone will benefit from it.

Summer outdoor parties are some of the best events of the year.

The warm balmy nights, food cooking on the grill, and friends and family spending quality time together in the backyard or around the pool create wonderful memories that last a lifetime. But, hosting outdoor events also means there's an increased risk of home fires.

Fortunately, following some simple safety tips and guidelines can help ensure you and your guests stay safe. Consider the following when you host your next outdoor event:

- Have an adult present at all times when a portable fireplace/firepit is burning
- Only use wood designed for the fire pit, not construction scrap(s), etc.
- NEVER use flammable liquids to start the fire(s)
- Keep all firepits away from any structures at least 15 feet.
- Keep anything that can burn, as well as children and pets, at least three feet away from open flames.
- Don't use a fire pit on a deck or any combustible surface that could catch fire as a result of any ashes that could fall from the pit.
- Have a water hose or fire extinguisher handy in case of an emergency, as well as a cell phone to call 911 if necessary.

Outdoor entertaining by the numbers

- Outside fireplaces or fire pits caused nearly 3,700 grass and brush fires
- Total outdoor patio heater or fire pit injuries has nearly tripled in six years (1,330 to 3,608) from 2006 - 2012
- An average of 8,800 home fires involved grills, hibachis, or barbecues each year
