Tips for reducing trash from blowing around on windy days

- 1. The number one way to prevent blowing litter is to bag all your trash before placing it in the bin. This is especially important for small, lightweight items like Styrofoam packing peanuts.
- 2. Compact the trash if you have loose items, place bagged trash on top of them to prevent them from blowing out of the cart.
- 3. Making sure the lid is shut and bagging your household garbage prevents windblown litter while your container is curbside, as well as during the collection process.

This will help prevent trash from escaping your container or our collection trucks and landing onto the streets of your neighborhood.

Recycling

If possible, place heavier recyclables toward the top of the cart to weigh down loose papers, however, do not bag your recyclables to keep them from blowing out of the cart.

The bottom line is this - when it comes to garbage and recycling collection on a windy day, it only takes a little extra time to reduce blowing litter. Everyone will benefit from it.

The Pulse of the Police – May, 2019



Welcome all to the May 2019 edition of the Winterville Police Department Community Newsletter. We are gearing up for school letting out for the summer and for all the hot weather. Typically, the summer months tend to be the busier months from an activity perspective for our department, but as of now, we have not experienced much of an uptick in our criminal activity other than the issues of vehicle break-ins of unlocked vehicles in some of our neighborhoods. We continue to experience regular to semi-regular reports of fraud attempt activity through phone calls and email. Fortunately, due to media outlets reporting about these types of scams as well as law enforcement efforts to educate citizens, these attempts have mostly remained just that...attempts. I continue to encourage all of you to be extremely wary of phone calls and mail correspondence that involves you having to provide any type of information. A good rule would also be to double-check any call or mail you receive by contacting a number you find personally to assess if the call or email you received was legitimate.

I received a letter from a Winterville citizen that I would like to share. This citizen had vehicle trouble and was stranded on Old Tar Road. Winterville officers responded and pushed the vehicle out of the roadway to a safe location. Although this may sound routine and expected, this citizen commented that their demeanor, attitude and willingness to stay calm and assist was beyond their law enforcement duties to the extent that she wrote to me. takeaway and perception in her interaction with the officers is invaluable as we strive to defeat perceptions that some may have about the police. Our officers are sons, daughters, fathers and mothers just as the citizens we serve. Thank you for your recognition when we succeed and notification if we stumble.
