### **Energy Saving Tips**

- Set your thermostat to 78F in the summer and 68F in the winter every degree of extra heating or cooling will increase energy usage 6% to 8%.
- Your HVAC system is normally your home's biggest electric consumer and typically accounts for half or more of your home's energy consumption. Service your HVAC system regularly. Easy maintenance such as routinely replacing, or cleaning air filters every 30 days can lower your heating and cooling system's energy consumption by up to 15 percent.
- Turn off the lights when they're not in use. Lighting accounts for about 12% of a typical residential utility bill.

### BEWARE OF THE GREASE GOBLIN

Did You Know...

Most sanitary sewer backups occur between your home and the Town's sewer main? You can help prevent a costly and unsanitary overflow by following a few simple steps:

### Do

- **Scrape excess grease in a container and dispose of it in** the garbage.
- **Orace food scraps in waste containers or garbage bags** for disposal with solid wastes, or start a compost pile; promote use of scraping prior to washing.
- **O** Place a wastebasket in the bathroom to dispose of solid wastes. Disposable diapers, condoms, and personal hygiene products do not belong in the sewer system.
- Promote the concept of "3 R's": Reduce, Reuse, Recycle.

#### Do Not

- Pour grease, fats, and oils from cooking down the drain.
- Use the toilet as a wastebasket.
- Use the sewer as a means of disposing food scraps.

#### Yard Waste

### Are You Contributing to Storm Drain Blockage?

- If you are placing your grass clippings, leaves, limbs, or other debris in the streets, storm drains, or drainage ways; then the answer is yes.
- You are contributing to storm drain blockage. These not only create a visible nuisance, but it creates major problems:
- It causes a traffic hazard due to vehicles turning out to miss it.
- As it rains the waste is washed down into the storm drain system and builds up, which in turn causes flooding problems.
- Do not place grass clipping, yards debris, or anything else in the storm drain ditches. These drainage ways must remain open and clear of debris to keep from flooding.


### Waste Pick Up By the Town

The Town of Winterville will **NOT** pick up any yard waste that is placed in the streets. Yard waste must be placed behind the curb and away from utility poles and other services for the town to pick it up . Chapter 98.028 of the Code of Ordinances prohibits placement of objects in streets, gutters, and other drainage ways. .....
